<u>Living with the Sandy Bay</u> <u>Rivulet</u>

<u>Sandy Bay Road—Dr Syntax</u> <u>Hotel</u>

Damage and erosion of the rivulet bank in the vicinity of the Dr Syntax Hotel has been a source of concern for some time.

We intend to seek funding for remedial action, with the support of the HCC, through the appropriate Commonwealth water programs.

Any views you may have on the nature of the remedial works would be welcome.

Liaison with HCC

We now have a mechanism in place which gives us warning of any HCC works in the rivulet. All contact will be directed through the Secretary.



We have met with officers of the HCC, on site, and discussed action necessary to rehabilitate the rivulet in the Parliament St area.

This will involve the Friends in planting of shrubs and trees—so await for a call for help in the New Year.
